
# Welcome to the Longsands Sixth Form



# **Study Skills**

You can be proud of achieving sufficiently strong GCSE grades to qualify for Level 3 courses in our Sixth Form. As you begin this next step of your education, it is vital for you to appreciate that the requirements of Level 3 courses are greater and that you will need commitment and diligence to be successful. You will need to take responsibility for your progress and undertake enough independent study to meet the demands of each of your subjects. Any periods on your timetable where you are not in lessons are designated as study periods where you should be using this non contact time to enhance and consolidate your learning.

## You are expected to study and revise for 30 hours each week, including:

16 hours per week – timetabled lessons and enrichment

15 hours per week – independent study (5 hours per subject per week)

This means that you will be completing a minimum of five hours of independent study per subject per week.

We provide the following areas for your study:

#### **GROUND FLOOR**

#### Cafe Area

This is a relaxed space for students to eat, drink and study.

The Coffee Cube Cafe accepts contactless payment and ParentPay.

# SECOND FLOOR Silent Area

This is a silent study space for **Year 12 and 13 students to complete** independent study. Please avoid creating noise from your mobile phones, headphones or electronic devices.

The photocopier can be found on this floor.

## **FIRST FLOOR**

#### **Quiet Area**

This is a quiet space for independent or small group work, with minimal and quiet conversations.

Drinks and snacks can be eaten here.

#### THIRD FLOOR

#### **Silent Area**

This is a silent study space for **Year 12 and 13 students to complete** independent study. Please avoid creating noise from your mobile phones, headphones or electronic devices. The photocopier can be found on this floor.

#### **THE LIBRARY**

#### **Quiet Area**

Longsands operates a high-quality Library with a number of very useful resources. All Sixth Form students will be allowed to use the Library during the day (when it is not used for lessons) and before and after the learning day for silent study. Please adhere to the following:

- 1. No eating or drinking is permitted at any time.
- 2. Students are not allowed to use their mobile phone in the Library.
- 3. Students must adhere politely and respectfully to requests from all staff whilst they use the Library.
- 4. Please remember that Sixth Form students are expected to set an example to younger students at all times.

## **Tutor Programme**

When you enrol in our Sixth Form you will be given a tutor. Your tutor is there to help you make the best use of your time in order that you gain the maximum benefit from your Sixth Form experience. Tutors work alongside students in a partnership. You should aim to make use of their help and develop a good working relationship with them. They are your main point of contact and are there to support you through your Sixth Form journey.

During tutor time, students will have the opportunity to explore a variety of important topics including:

- Post 18 destinations support
- Applications to University and further education, including Unifrog and UCAS
- Application support and guidance for apprenticeships
- Student finance and financial planning
- Personal Development
- Revision techniques that work and exam preparation
- Employment skills and applications processes
- Student health and wellbeing

## **Assemblies**

In addition to the tutor programme, students will have a weekly assembly. Attendance is compulsory as the assemblies are used to give further support to the tutor programme. Students will be notified of any changes to the assembly schedule where appropriate.

## **Attendance, Absence and Illness**

Regularly attending Sixth Form is the foundation of educational success. High attendance is celebrated throughout the year and we expect students to achieve 96% attendance or above. Our Attendance Policy can be viewed on the school website.

Students with excellent attendance will benefit in the following ways:

- Good references for further education or employment
- Continuity of learning, making progress easier, and enhancing performance in assessments and examinations
- Not missing out on events and social activities which help to build long-lasting friendships.

If you are unexpectedly unwell or unable to attend a lesson or a whole day, we ask that your parents/carers notify us with the reason for your absence. We remind students that it must be a parent or carer who contacts the school with information about their absence, as we need parental consent for any absences that do occur.

# **Medical/Dental/Planned Appointments**

All unavoidable absences, that are not due to illness, must be arranged with the school by completing a Sixth Form Absence Request form. These forms are available from outside the Sixth Form offices.

If it is unavoidable for you to miss a lesson/s:

- Complete an absence request form explaining the reason for the absence and stating the day/s and time/s that will be affected and hand this form to Mrs Walton.
- Speak to the teacher of every lesson that you will be missing and agree the work you will complete to cover your absence
- Catch up on work missed due to leave of absence from Longsands Sixth Form.

## Lateness

Students should arrive at Longsands before 08:40, ready for a prompt start at 08:45 each school-day morning.

Persistent lateness to registration and/or lessons will be followed up with a meeting with the school attendance officer and or the student's Head of Year.



# **E-Learning Platforms**

Longsands Sixth Form uses the Microsoft Office Suite via the Office 365 platform. Students can access their accounts both on and off-site using the same username and password. To access your school email and files from home, please go to the school website and click on the Staff/Student login at the top of the page and choose the Office 365 option. If you enter your username and password you will be able to access Outlook through the app launcher found on the left of the window.

Featured below you will find the different apps that are used through the Office 365 platform along with other frequently used applications:

#### Office 365 platform



**OUTLOOK** This is our email sever for staff and students. Students are required the check their emails daily and this is one of the main uses of communication with Sixth Form students.



**FORMS** Can be used by the Sixth Form team to gather feedback through surveys, or departments for assessments and guizzes.



**ONEDRIVE** This is the storage for individual students documents and work. The OneDrive can be accessed anywhere with an internet connection and is a safer way to save and access work rather than running the risk of losing/corrupting items.



**TEAMS** Is the 'online classroom.' Teams is a central online group where teachers can upload video presentations or live lessons. Materials and student files can also be used in Teams.

#### Post-18 Destinations



**Unifrog** is a web-based app that includes tools to search for degree and apprenticeship opportunities. It includes an extensive careers library and Unifrog advice on how to apply for apprenticeships and degrees. Students in Year 12 will be provided with username and sign-up details during the autumn term.



**UCAS hub** is the new web site that supports students with both degree and UCAS apprenticeship applications. Students can create an account in Year 12 and then use the same account to apply for university courses through the main UCAS web pages.

## **Dress Code**

Our academic standards are high at Longsands Sixth Form and with that comes high expectations of our students. This applies to work ethic and effort but also presentation and appearance. As the most senior students in the school, Sixth Form students represent the values and ethos expected at Longsands.

t is important to maintain high standards of personal appearance; the Sixth Form is a place of study and work and the dress code reflects that. The general principle is that all students should wear an appropriate smart dress for school. Please note that students are not permitted to wear items of clothing with offensive logos/images. In some instances, students who attend Sixth Form inappropriately dressed may be asked to go home and change.

Student lanyards must be worn at all times when on the Longsands site, for safeguarding, gate access and photocopying.

### The following are permitted:

- √ Smart Jeans, trousers or tracksuits
- ✓ Shorts and skirts
- √ Shirts, blouses, t-shirts and jumpers
- √ Smart trainers and shoes

Most jewellery is considered acceptable, however, students may be required to remove items if they are engaged in a practical activity where the jewellery represents a health and safety risk to themselves or others.

Student should also wear appropriate clothing for practical lessons in PE, Sport, Geography/Geology and Science subjects.

#### ID cards and lanyards

Student lanyards and ID cards must be worn at all times when on the Longsands site, for safeguarding, gate access and photocopying. Students must scan in using the Biostore boxes each time they enter and leave the school site.

The Biostore boxes can be found on the ground floor of the Sixth Form block and on entry by the Six Doors.



# **Enrichment (Wednesday Period 5)**

Sixth Form students have a wide range of opportunities to develop their skills outside the classroom. We provide a wide and interesting range of enrichment opportunities at Sixth Form level.

#### This includes the provision of:

- Extra-curricular activities
- Sports team representation
- Academic writing (MOOC)
- Fundraising
- Volunteering
- The opportunity to complete work experience
- A number of specific Sixth Form day and residential trips which includes several trips abroad

# Health, Wellbeing & Support

Mr Smith and Mrs Alder help to support the wellbeing services available to all our Sixth Form students. If you need to talk to someone about your mental health or require support of any kind, then you can go to the Sixth Form building where they are both situated, alternatively you can reach out to either if them in person or by emailing them via Edward.Smith@astrea-longsands.org or Suzanne.Alder@astrea-longsands.org and they will get back to you as soon as possible. Every member of the Longsands Sixth Form has the right to learn in a safe, secure and caring environment in order to realise their true potential in all aspects of Longsands life, free from humiliation, intimidation and abuse. They also have the responsibility to contribute, in whatever way they can to the protection and maintenance of such an environment. Therefore, Longsands does not tolerate bullying, including cyber bullying, and all incidents are taken seriously.

## **IT Accounts and Email**

All students will be issued with an IT log on and email account at the start of the year. Students are expected to check their account daily for information from their subject teachers or from the wider Sixth Form team.

## Lockers

There are lockers provided in the café area on the ground floor of the Sixth Form building. Students should see Mr Smith to arrange the use of a locker, and pay a £5 deposit at the Sixth Form admin centre, which will be returned upon handing back the key at the end of the year.

## **Mobile Phones**

Sixth Form students may use their phones in the Sixth Form block and with their teacher's permission during a lesson or tutor time, if a task requires the use of their phone or the internet. Students should not use their mobile phones in any other part of the Academy, including corridors, car parks, and the library. Members of staff are required to confiscate a Sixth Form student's mobile phone if it has been used outside of the Sixth Form block or without permission.

Headphones are NOT to be worn when moving between locations on the school site. If a student is seen wearing headphones, the member of staff is required to confiscate them. Confiscated items can be collected from student services after the student's last lesson that day. Students may be required to hand in their mobile or headphones for a second day depending on the circumstances of the confiscation.



# **Part-Time Employment**

We recognise the importance of part time work and value the opportunity it offers to students to develop their independence and teamworking skills. Being employed between the ages of 16 and 19 is one of the best predictors of employment during your twenties.

We ask that students do not work during the learning day of 08:45 to 16:10.

We also recommend that students do not work for more than 12 hours each week as this has been correlated with higher chances of dropping out and a failure to make good progress.

## **Post-18 Destinations**

We have an extensive careers programme in the Sixth Form and begin helping students to consider what their future pathway options during the Autumn term of Year 12, through assemblies and activities in the destinations portal Unifrog.

During the Spring term of Year 12, all students and parents will be invited to a Future Pathways event to discover more about the different pathways and important considerations like Student Finance.

If you would like a careers meetings you can request one with your Tutor or Head of Year at any time during the school year.

# **Work Experience**

All students have an opportunity to complete a week's work experience at the end of Year 12. This should be arranged privately and as far as possible, linked to any potential future career.

# **Vehicle Parking on Site**

Students are allowed to park their vehicles on site after acquiring a car parking permit. Students must use the designated Sixth Form student parking spaces, that are labelled in front of the Sports Pavilion. There is also extra parking available outside of the main gate, opposite to the bus bays. Sixth Form car parking permits can be collected from Mrs Walton.



## **16-19 Bursary**

This is a government run scheme. The 16 to 19 Bursary Fund supports the most financially disadvantaged 16-to-19-year-olds and those young people who most need help with the costs of staying in education. There are 2 types of 16 to 19 bursaries:

- a vulnerable bursary of up to £1,200 a year for young people in one of the defined vulnerable groups.
- discretionary bursaries that institutions award to meet individual needs. For example, transport, meals, books and equipment.



## **Fire Alarm Procedure**

If the fire alarm sounds, we ask that all students in the Sixth Form block immediately vacate the block and assemble on the grass by the astroturf football courts.

Tutors should make their way to the astroturf courts and make sure that their tutor group are in alphabetical order and standing in a quiet and orderly fashion.

# **Behaviour expectations**

Every student in our Sixth Form deserves to feel safe, happy and able to enjoy their time with us. We will not tolerate behaviour which disrupts the learning of others and equally, we consider any behaviour that might cause offence or harm to another person, as a breach of the standards we expect our students to strive to achieve. In order to assist with the management of academic concerns we have a centralised system which tracks work owed by students and organises a catchup session. Where a student is finding it particularly difficult to meet expectations, we work more closely with the student and their family to ensure they have every opportunity to succeed.

A student failing to meet the academic expectations of the Sixth Form will be offered different levels of support following the stages described below.

Stage 1	Classroom teacher issues a C2 for failing to meet expectations and the student attends a support session with a member of the Sixth Form team to complete the work to the expected standard
Stage 2	Failure to attend stage 1 meeting or work still not up to expectations. The student has a meeting with their HOY and a new support session is arranged.
Stage 3	Failure to attend stage 2 meeting or work still not up to expectations. A parental meeting between the HOY, parent/carer and student is arranged. An after school catch up session is set up.
Stage 4	Failure to attend the stage 3 meeting or work is still not up to expectations.  A student progress review meeting is arranged where the student will be required to meet with a careers advisor and all of the possible future pathways discussed to determine which is the most suitable for the student.

# **Computing code of conduct**

We ask Sixth Form students to keep their passwords private; to avoid plagiarism (copying from friends or online sources); to not access or download material that is in breach of copyright law; to not access, download or share inappropriate material; to not download or install any software on the school computers; to not tamper with or damage any computer hardware or software; and to not use Sixth Form systems or resources for profit-making activities.

We would like to remind students that it is good practice to ensure that all of your work is backed up your OneDrive area.

# Tobacco, Vaping, and illegal substances

We remind students that the Longsands site is both smoke- and vape-free and that they are not permitted to smoke or vape anywhere inside the school boundary. We also do not tolerate the bringing, use or selling of illegal substances anywhere within the school boundary.

# **Energy drinks and take-aways**

Sixth Form students are asked not to bring energy drinks and take-aways onto the Longsands site.

## **Praise and Rewards**

We want students to be proud of their achievements. Our rewards are based around our House System. House points can be awarded to students for:

- Working Hard
- Being Kind
- Achieving More

We highly value all the achievements of our Sixth Form students, whether these be in academia, volunteering, participation, enrichment activities, or in representing the Sixth Form. All House Points go towards the grand total for one of our five Houses in the House Cup competition.

Special subject prizes are awarded at our annual Awards Evening and we hold a number of events throughout the year to celebrate our students' effort and achievement.

# Photocopying and printing

Students are permitted to use the school photocopiers to print their work. Each week students will receive a small number of free printing credits. These credits do not carry over to subsequent weeks, so we encourage students to print any resources that they require throughout the year. The most accessible photocopiers for Sixth Form students to use can be found on the second floor of the Sixth Form block and the Longsands Library.

# **Monitoring and Reporting Progress**

During your time in the Sixth Form there are various points when staff will report in different ways on your progress, how hard you are working and what grades you are likely to gain at the end of your courses.

For each one of your subjects, you will receive a Target Grade. This grade is set by comparing what students gained nationally in their Level 3 courses when they started from the same GCSE performance as you. These are not predicted grades for you. They are a base-line against which you and your teachers can track your progress. On average, our students achieve at least one grade above this baseline and many of our students achieve two or even three grades above this. In addition, at regular intervals, your teachers will give you a Teacher Forecast Grade. This is the grade that they think is the most likely outcome for you at the end of the course in Year 13. This enables you to see how much progress you are making. These are reported regularly, along with an Attitude to Learning Grade for each subject studied.

The Sixth Form team will monitor student progress very carefully to ensure that all students achieve their full potential.

## **Examinations**

All students will be issued with guidance regarding examination procedures and an individual timetable will be emailed to each student. Longsands pays all examination entry fees, with the exception of re-sits. Any query relating to examinations should be directed to Mrs Carpenter, Exams Manager via margaret.carpenter@astrea-longsands.org.



# **Belonging**










Kings Road car park
